

Project SEARCH is a workplace immersion program for students with intellectual disabilities in their final year of high school. It is a collaborative program between Education, Voc Rehab, Developmental Disabilities Services and a local business. This one-year program offers career exploration and job training through business-based internships. The goal is to have students learn transferrable skills via internships that lead to complex competitive employment.
