- Weekend three, January 11-12, 2020: Capitol Plaza, Montpelier

Graduation take place at the Vermont State House in Montpelier on Disability Awareness Day, usually in February.

What are the deadlines? To be considered for the Vermont Leadership Series Class of 2020, your application must be received by Leadership coordinators by Tuesday, September 3, 2019. You may choose to email your application by this date, but a hard copy must also be post-mailed.
