The Senate Committee on Education has launched bill S.326 to fix the State's Special Education Advisory Panel to bring it in compliance with federal law and is made up of a majority of parents of children with disabilities and individuals with disabilities. What is Work-Based Learning?

Many youth in high school participate in [work-based learning](#) experiences in preparation for post-school life. These activities involve actual work experience or connect classroom learning to employment and careers. Work-based learning includes apprenticeships, cooperative work experience, internships, job shadowing, paid work, and service-learning employment. One program that can help with post-school employment for individuals with disabilities is [Ticket to Work](#). By using their "Ticket," Social Security disability beneficiaries, ages 18 through 64, can seek free employment services through their state [Vocational Rehabilitation](#) (VR) agency. Behavior and the IEP

If your child, who is on an Individualized Education Program (IEP), displays behavior that interferes with their learning or that of other students, the IEP Team, which includes the parent, must consider, and include in the IEP when necessary, the use of positive behavioral interventions and supports, and other strategies, to address that behavior. The Federal Department of Education (ED) has issued [guidance](#) regarding this issue. The [Functional Behavior Assessment \(FBA\)](#) can be an important tool in the development of a positive behavior plan for your child.

News from the Puppets

The Puppets kicked off their Anxiety Pilot Project in Proctor, VT this month! The program, for students in grades Pre-K through 4, features tips on how to recognize when worry is a problem, and tools for how to deal with it. Audience members help the puppets with their worry and also get a chance to practice the tools that they learned during a "pass the puppet" circle time. The program is designed for small groups (up to 50 students) and will be touring throughout Vermont through June. Support from the Vermont Department of Mental Health and the National Life Group Foundation is making this project possible.
