



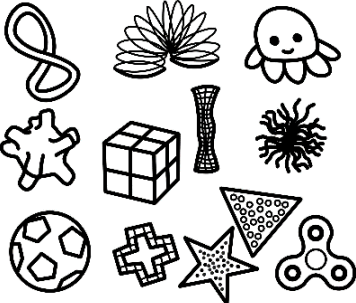



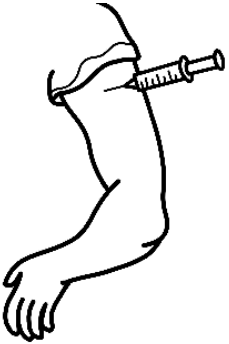
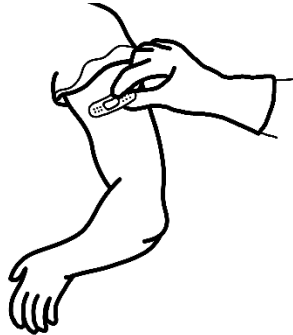




Confident Care for Kids: Vax visits with less stress
