

Vermont Respite Support Program

Vermont Family Network (VFN) was awarded a grant by the Vermont Department of Children and Families-Child Development Division to assist families with respite care cost. We are also here to offer support and resources to families as they navigate medical and healthcare financing systems.

Respite

Respite provides a temporary safe haven and meaningful experience for a child that allows short-term relief for parents or primary family caregivers to attend to their own and other family members' health, social, or emotional needs. It is a preventive strategy that strengthens families, protects their health and well-being, and allows parents and/or caregivers to continue providing care at home. Respite can be an important part of family support and long-term services that are available to caregivers. Respite may include short-term care (ranging from a few hours to a few weeks of time, per year), intended to enable the family to stay together and to keep the child living in the home and primary community.

Eligibility

- Vermont resident
- Parent/Caregiver with a child (up to the age of 19) with chronic physical, medical, mental, or developmental condition OR
 - Are experiencing "special needs" that are destabilizing, for instance: homelessness, economic hardships, and/or DCF Family Services involvement
 - Are suspected of a diagnosis, and waiting for an evaluation
 - Require health and related services of a type or amount beyond that required by children and youth generally
- Parent/Caregiver with a disability that has a child (up to the age of 19) living at home; or
- Relative caregiver with a child(ren) (up to the age of 19) living with them; or
- Parent/Caregiver of an adopted child(ren).
- Must not be currently using or receiving other respite funding

Process

Families will do a phone application and submit a respite plan. Families currently receiving respite funding are not eligible, this includes: Agency Directed Respite, Family Managed Respite, Flexible Family Funding, or VFN's Family Support Funding. Once approved for funding, families will submit a voucher with respite provider signature. VFN will then reimburse the family within two weeks of receiving the voucher. W9's are required for any amount reimbursed over \$600.



Respite Provider Information

- All Respite Providers must be at least 20 years old and be someone other than a parent or direct caregiver. Relatives are acceptable respite providers <u>but may not</u> reside within the home.
- Rate of pay and number of hours for respite care is determined by the caregiver but may not exceed \$1,000.
