

FOUR CORNERSTONES OF INTERAGENCY COLLABORATION

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Dr. Jacqui Kelleher (she/her) - Executive Director of Vermont Family Network whose mission is to empower and support all Vermont children, youth, and families, especially those with disabilities, disorders, or special health needs. Dr. Kelleher worked as the State Director of Special Education with the Vermont Agency of Education from 2019-2022 prior to VFN. She oversaw the implementation of special education policies, practices, and procedures with federal and state laws for districts in the state. In this role, she viewed VFN as a critical partner and was a vocal proponent of the education system's need to partner with parents to serve students best. She is also the parent of four now-adult children with disabilities and disorders, including autism, ADHD, depression, seizure disorder, and specific learning disabilities. She understands firsthand the lived experience of families navigating essential but complex systems to support their loved ones.
