High School Programs

The Bridging Program at CCS helps students negotiate the transition from high school to adulthood. It is offered at, coordinated by, CCS in partnership with Burlington, Colchester, Mt. Mansfield Union, South Burlington, and Winooski High Schools.

The EHS Employment Program

Designed to give students who have a disability the necessary employment experience to be successful in the workforce.

Landmark College

Offers a summer program for students with learning disabilities to prepare for college.

Next Steps Program

A youth transition program that provides employment and educational exploration

experiences for high school juniors and seniors considering college or specific career tracks following high school graduation.

School2Work

A unique and collaborative career development initiative that prepares Chittenden County high school students with intellectual and developmental disabilities for successful transitions to - and employment in - the competitive workplace.

Job Corps

A free education and training program that helps young people learn a career, earn a high school diploma or GED, and find and keep a good job. For eligible young people at least 16 years of age that qualify as low income, Job Corps provides the all-around skills needed to succeed in a career and in life.
