

The Flexible Pathways Initiative and Special Education

Act 77, the <u>Flexible Pathways Initiative</u>, was passed in 2013 by the Vermont legislature to:

- Encourage and support the creativity of school districts as they develop and expand high-quality educational experiences that are an integral part of secondary education in the evolving 21st Century classroom
- Promote opportunities for Vermont students to achieve postsecondary readiness through high-quality educational experiences that acknowledge individual goals, learning styles, and abilities
- Increase the rates of secondary school completion and postsecondary continuation in Vermont

What is a Personalized Learning Plan?

- A <u>Personalized Learning Plan (PLP)</u> is an ongoing process where students in grades 7-12 work with educators, family members and other engaged adults to identify emerging abilities, aptitudes and interests that will help guide decisions about postsecondary education and training goals and experiences
- These experiences could also include <u>Dual Enrollment</u>, <u>Career Technical</u>
 <u>Education</u>, <u>Early College</u>, <u>Virtual Learning</u> and <u>Work-Based Learning</u>
