When a child with a disability or special health need requires services from multiple organizations, and families need help with coordinating those services, they may be eligible for a Coordinated Services Plan (CSP).

What is a Parent Representative?

- A parent representative, or parent rep, is a person with lived experience who can help you navigate the Coordinated Service Plan process.
- They can talk with you before the CSP
 meeting about what is important to you,
 your concerns and/or goals for the CSP
 meeting. The parent rep can go over the
 CSP form and some of the questions that
 will be asked at the meeting.
- They may ask how they can best support you during the meeting. It could be by asking questions, acting as a jargon buster, or reminding you about something you wanted to be sure was addressed at the meeting.
